How to set up the outline you will use for the research paper:

## **Title**

**Thesis:** Write out the thesis word for word. Note these are the only 2 parts that can be in sentences. From this point on, everything else must be in words or phrases, parallel to each other.

Important rules: The number of A's, B's, and C's, as well as the 1's, 2's, and 3's, may vary by paragraph. However, if there is an A, there must be a B. If there is a 1, there must be a 2.

## Sequence

- · Periods should line up.
- · First word in each entry is capitalized
- Then capitalize only proper nouns/adi
- Items in each level of outline must be written in parallel sentence structure
- Use words/phrases only. Do NOT write in complete sentences.
- Content of outline must match essay.
