Thesis: Write out the thesis word for word. Note these are the only 2 parts that can be in sentences. From this point on, everything else must be in words or phrases, parallel to each other.

Important rules: The number of A's, B's, and C's, as well as the 1's, 2's, and 3's, may vary by paragraph. However, if there is an A, there must be a $B$. If there is a 1, there must be a 2.
